My Dear Parish Family:

Following the long winter months, we rejoice in the warm days of springtime and summer. It's time for farmers and gardeners to plant their seeds, hoping for a bountiful crop later in the summer and fall. Their success depends on many variables: the placement of the seeds so they will be securely rooted; rich soil that provides a base for the roots to hold in place while supplying them with the necessary nutrients for the plant to grow strong; sunlight and water – not too much and not too little.

In today's Gospel, Jesus assures us of a bountiful harvest. Jesus speaks to a large crowd in a manner that *they could* understand. He speaks to us so *we, too, will hear and understand*; searching our hearts and minds, and asking ourselves, how am I nurturing the seed of my life? Am I a sower whose seed fell on bad soil, rocky ground, and intertwined with thorns? Am I preoccupied with things that distract me from what is of God, truly important and worthwhile? Am I allowing my heart and mind to be consumed with material goods, ignoring the treasure that God has promised me? Or, do I hear His words, but when the journey becomes too difficult, I refuse to love Him with my heart and soul? Jesus tells us that when the seed falls on good soil, a heart and mind that hears and understands when he speaks, the fruit will be abundant.

Saint Paul writes that the sufferings we now experience “*are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us*” (Rom 8:18). Despite Saint Paul's words, we continue to struggle...struggle with sin, pain and sorrow. It is not just you and I who suffer in this world, but all of creation is subject to the detriment of sin. However, Saint Paul gives us hope and reminds us that the Spirit of God has breathed life into us; we are God's children.

Isaiah writes that God promises that it is His word that guarantees the existence between heaven and earth will never be destroyed; the seed of life will never die.

The farmers work diligently to nurture their crops. Their lives depend on the bounty they bring to market. Our lives depend on the bounty we sow on this earth. If we profess to love God, we must know Him, hear His word and understand it. Jesus told us this. Let us not abandon those seeds that have been lost. When we find one, let us nourish it back to life – life in Christ.
