Dear Parishioners of Holy Rosary:

It's hard to believe that I have been in residence at Holy Rosary Church for nine weeks and I only have about three more to spend with you. Don't worry. That means that I will still share in the reverence, excitement, and frenzy that accompany the Feast of the Assumption.

The only true regret I have about the pastoral experiences we receive as seminarians is the fact that each assignment is too terribly short. As my time here winds down, I recognize that with some of you, I have only had the joy of greeting you at the door and with a passing hello when I see you on the street. With others, I have shared in your joy and sorrow at very blessed and challenging times in your life. With all of you, however, I thought it fitting to share some of my experience here this summer.

One of the things that I have appreciated the most about being here has been the pleasant experience of working with Fr. Previte, Deacon Bruce Battista, Anne DeMarco, Laura Bastulli Parran, Maureen Brown, Johanna Bacik, Ülle Laido, and Tammy Moore. I cannot thank them enough for their commitment to serving this parish and the wider Church, as well as the sacrifices that they have made for the benefit of serving God and his kingdom. Their own particular witnesses to God's love and action in their lives have further inspired me to do the same. Each one of these people wants nothing more than for all of us to come to know the Lord in his infinite love.

Pope Francis has said that a pastor should smell like his sheep. I don't anticipate this being much of an issue for me. My favorite times this summer have been when I was with you all; certainly at the celebration of the Sacraments and entering into prayer with the students of Newman Catholic Campus Ministry, but also in the more ordinary times of celebrating a graduation, or attending an event on the Wade Oval.

One of the most formative and moving experiences for me has been to take the Eucharist to members of the parish in their homes. To hear their stories of life in the parish and in the neighborhood gave me a more complete understanding of what this parish has meant to the lives of countless people. Their generosity has been incomparable in welcoming me into your parish family. Their longing for communion with all of us and with Jesus in the Eucharist has inspired me to love more, and to enter more deeply into my own life of prayer.

As I look around this parish, I'm not ready to leave. I truly believe that you are primed to do extraordinary things in the life of this community and in the Church. I see so many people who have been here for some time and want to see this parish thrive. I see people who have known the love of God in their lives and want to share it with others. I see a pastor and staff who are willing to go to extremes to serve the Church, and I have been blessed to witness it.

The kingdom of God is truly breaking into the world here and now, through you and me, and in this community. Real treasure lies in your life of faith, through the community of the Church. Offer your whole heart to God and be a part of the kingdom, making it a reality here and now.

I welcome your prayers for me as I go forth. They are the only reason I could make it this far. I will surely return the favor as I continue in my formation.

HOLY ROSARY CULTURE OF LIFE MINISTRY

The Gospel of Life... “As I emphatically stated at Denver, on the occasion of the Eighth World Youth Day, ‘with time the threats against life have not grown weaker. They are taking on vast proportions. They are not only threats coming from the outside, from the forces of nature or the ‘Cains’ who kill the ‘Abels’; no, they are *scientifically and systematically programmed threats*. The twentieth century will have been an era of massive attacks on life, an endless series of wars and a continual taking of innocent human life. False prophets and false teachers have had the greatest success.’... **we are in fact faced by an objective ‘conspiracy against life,’ involving even international Institutions**, engaged in encouraging and carrying out actual campaigns to make contraception, sterilization and abortion widely available.” *Evangelium vitae*

...in the World

Peruvian Cardinal Juan Luis Cipriani has strongly criticized efforts by international pro-abortion organizations to negatively influence foreign investment in Peru unless the country adopts laws favorable to their causes. On his radio program “Faith Dialogues” recently, he called these efforts to promote agendas through financial means nothing but “blackmail,” and demanded Peruvian lawmakers ignore them.

“It is not a question of other democratic countries with more money, such as the United States, intervening in ours,” pointed out the prelate. “We can have political synergy on political and migratory matters with other countries; **but we cannot allow other countries and international organizations to demand that foreign investment in Peru be tied to their social and legal agendas. That is blackmail.**” “We cannot compromise a country’s autonomy in matters as important as the defense of life and of marriage between one man and one woman. I will believe this even unto death. Life is an absolute good and cannot be subject to conditions,” he said. “It’s not that the Church wishes to impose its ideas.
