My Dear Parish Family:

Matthew's Gospel begins with Jesus and his disciples entering a boat to search for a deserted place in which to retreat along the Sea of Galilee, possibly to avoid potential danger after John the Baptist's execution. Jesus, who had become well known to the people of Galilee, discovered a crowd of a few thousand people waiting for him as he came ashore. Wherever he went, crowds of people gathered to meet him: the rich and poor, social outcasts and pagans. Contrary to the advice of his disciples, Jesus remained and healed them physically and spiritually, always speaking to them the word of God. Jesus' compassion showed the crowd God's deep love for them.

The account of Jesus feeding the five thousand is the only miracle recorded in all four Gospels. This miracle recalls the miraculous supply of manna in the wilderness in the story of Exodus. The supply of food provided for the Israelites during their forty-year journey in the wilderness foreshadows the bread of life which Jesus gave to his disciples at the last supper the night before he died. It is this bread, the body of Jesus Christ, that will sustain you and me on our journey to the kingdom of heaven. Throughout this Gospel, Jesus is teaching his disciples as well as the people who are served. He gives them confidence in distributing the abundance of food, preparing them for the mission that lies ahead of them. Is he not doing that for us as well? How will we live out our mission?

In the first reading Isaiah assures us that God's love for his children is very real. God asks us to listen to him and we will have abundant life. Do we believe in God's providence? Are we willing to be his agent in sharing our time and treasure for the benefit of others?

Saint Paul assures us that no creature can separate us from God's love. Our lives are filled with joys and sadness...tragedies that sometimes seem irreversible. It is in these perilous times that our awareness of God's love becomes real to us. It is in his love that we feel ultimate peace.

In twelve short days we will begin our celebration of the Feast of our Lady's Assumption into heaven. Our parish will host thousands of people of all ages and varied backgrounds, not unlike the crowds who followed Jesus. For some it is an annual homecoming. Others come to enjoy the festivities of fun and good food. Many come for the first time inquisitive about the Feast: *Who is Mary? Why are people praying to her statue? What's the reason for lighting the candles and placing them around her? What is the Assumption?* Many visitors come with a story: a family member or friend is seriously ill, others live with the reality of unemployment, a broken relationship; they bring with them their own personal cross. The four days of the Feast is an opportunity to *live* today's Scriptures. We cannot honestly participate in the Mass, hear God's Word and receive the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, and not use this time to evangelize all that we profess to believe and share the abundant love that God has given so freely to us. Whether a volunteer at the Feast or at home, unable to physically be here, please pray for all who come, neighbors and strangers alike. If we each touch the heart of just one person, the Feast of Our Lady's Assumption will have been a great success. How will we live out our mission as disciples of Jesus Christ? If we believe in our Father's providence, *He* will lead our way.

**HOLY ROSARY CULTURE OF LIFE MINISTRY**

**The Gospel of Life...** “We have to go to the heart of the tragedy being experienced by modern man: *the eclipse of the sense of God and of man*, typical of a social and cultural climate dominated by secularism, which, with its ubiquitous tentacles, succeeds at times in putting Christian communities themselves to the test. Those who allow themselves to be influenced by this climate easily fall into a sad vicious circle: *when the sense of God is lost, there is also a tendency to lose the sense of man*, of his dignity and his life; in turn, the systematic violation of the moral law, especially in the serious matter of respect for human life and its dignity, produces a kind of progressive darkening of the capacity to discern God’s living and saving presence.” St. John Paul II, *Evangelium Vitae*

**...in the World** A United Nations “human rights” panel has told Ireland it should revise its highly restrictive abortion laws. Following months of debate in the Catholic country, Ireland’s parliament voted to allow limited access to abortion for the first time last year but restricted it to cases when a woman’s life is in danger. The U.N. Human Rights Committee remained highly critical of the law, saying the Irish government should provide for additional exceptions. The Irish Pro-Life Campaign responded to the report by saying the U.N. has no proper standing on human rights to be able to criticize Ireland. “To be honest, I’m not the least bit surprised by today’s report”, said chairwoman Cora Sherlock. “The recent hearings in Geneva were a complete charade from start to finish. The U.N.’s Human Rights Committee has shown itself to be incredibly biased on abortion and has not the slightest concern for the rights of unborn babies throughout the full nine months of pregnancy.”
