My Dear Parish Family:

A few weeks ago, I joined over 200 other deacons at the National Diaconal Institute of Continuing Education (NDICE) conference where I had the opportunity to hear several very good speakers who provided information and suggestions to help us to become more effective servants of God's people. Among these speakers was the fairly well-known Catholic author Matthew Kelly. In his latest book, "*The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic*," he provided a statistic-laden case (you know how I like statistics!) describing the current state of affairs and a path forward. In the following lines of this letter, I would like to lay out his observations and in my next four bulletin letters over the coming months I will highlight each of the *Four Signs* in more depth.

You have heard the common rule of thumb that 20% of the people do 80% of the work when it comes to voluntary participation, such as in a parish. The research revealed that the disparity is even more extreme. In US parishes, on average, 6.4% of the parish provides more than 80% of the voluntary man-hours and 6.8% of the population provides more than 80% of the financial resources! Not surprisingly, there is an 84% overlap in these groups – this means that by and large, they are the same folks. Put another way, about 7% of the Catholic population is responsible for the funding and execution of an incomparable amount of services and ministries under Catholic guidance. We refer to this 7% of the population as *engaged Catholics*.

It would be easy to be disheartened by these statistics but it is better to take a look at what is working well. To that end, Mr. Kelly's researchers interviewed a sample of *engaged Catholics* throughout the country and found that they have four things in common. The *Four Signs* are their commitment to regular **Prayer, Study, acts of Generosity and Evangelization**. Knowing that these are the characteristics we would love to have all parishioners to possess, the annual strategic plan he suggests is to grow the ranks of the *engaged Catholics* by 1% per year. If we are presently accomplishing all that we are with only 7%, imagine what we could do if we could increase the number by 1% per year. By 2021 we could double our capabilities! By the way, for Holy Rosary that means engaging a mere 7 or 8 additional people each year.

Next time I write to you, we will take a look at the prayer routine of these *engaged Catholics* and how we take the first steps in growing their numbers at Holy Rosary.
