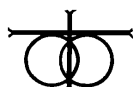

My Dear Parish Family,

In my last letter I wrote about “*The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic*,” which are **Prayer**, **Study**, acts of **Generosity** and **Evangelization**. In this letter I would like to dig a little deeper into the first of these signs, namely prayer.

Of all the signs, prayer is by far the most important because it drives everything else. When engaged Catholics were asked about their prayer life, what consistently emerged were two things – a *commitment* to daily prayer and a *routine* of daily prayer. The commitment means that they are dedicated to praying each and every day for at least 10 minutes and not only when a need arises or their mood suits them. This makes perfect sense if we understand prayer as conversation with a person with whom we wish to deepen a relationship. What can help us make and keep a commitment to pray daily? The answer is *routine*.

It was found that engaged Catholics have a specific routine to their daily prayer which includes a normal time, place, even a favorite chair and list of prayers. This routine within the routine is the product of trial and error until the person settles on what works for them. If you are new to this discipline (and the stats show that many of us are) I urge and pray that you give it your best effort! Making this commitment to prayer alone will change your life.

If you are just beginning at this, keep these hints in mind. First, start small. Commit to ONE minute of prayer time per day. Continue for a week or two to establish the routine then expand it to two minutes, then five and eventually ten. Secondly, do not be afraid of the quiet. Turn off the TV, radio, cell phones, PCs. It is easier to listen without distractions. Consider how many times the gospel tells us “Jesus went off to a lonely place to pray.” Prayer is the earmark of a disciple of Christ. Finally, be persistent, even tenacious, in keeping your routine. The evil one sees a person committed to prayer as an enemy soldier well equipped for battle and will do anything to distract you or discourage you. Do not allow this! Pray!

If you recall, in his homily last week Fr. Joe listed prayer, study and evangelization along with the sacraments as the best ways to get to know who Jesus is. Is this a coincidence? I think not. In my experience I see this as an affirmation of where the Holy Spirit is gently leading us. Next time we will look at the next sign, *study*.
