My Dear Parish Family,

Those of us who are cradle Catholics and baptized as infants have no recollection what it was like to be given the sign of the cross on our foreheads. As a toddler, imagine your parents holding your right hand in theirs tracing the cross, beginning on your forehead saying, *"In the name of the Father,"* (the first person of the Blessed Trinity and creator of all). Then your hand moves downward toward the chest and your mother or father says, *"and of the Son,"* (to show that the Son proceeds from the Father), and finally your hand is guided across from the left shoulder to the right, concluding, *"and of the Holy Spirit,"* (the third person of the Trinity, who proceeds from the Father and from the Son and *is* the love and charity that exists between the two).

Saint Francis de Sales wrote that in and of themselves, cross-like shapes and figures that we see in everyday images in buildings, etc., are just that – shapes and figures. However, when that cross-like symbol *"is meant to give honor to God, it becomes a holy ceremony, one that God uses to many good ends"* (St. Frances de Sales, The Sign of the Cross). It wasn't until Jesus Christ suffered and gave his life on the Cross that this instrument of darkness and death became a sign of triumph and hope. In today's first reading, Moses lifts up the snake in the desert. In the Gospel, Jesus reiterates Moses' action and adds, *"and so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."*

Today we, the Church, celebrate the *Exaltation of the Holy Cross*. The Church commemorates that in the year 326 relics of the True Cross, on which Jesus was crucified, were located. According to St. John Chrysostom, St. Helena (mother of the Emperor Constantine), nearing the end of her life and having received divine inspiration, traveled to Jerusalem to organize an excavation at the hill of Calvary searching for the True Cross. Three wooden crosses were located. According to one tradition, the inscription *"Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews"* remained attached to the True Cross. However, according to a more common tradition, the inscription was missing. To determine the True Cross, Saint Helena and Saint Macarius, then the Patriarch of Jerusalem, had the crosses brought to a dying woman. Upon touching the True Cross, she was healed. They then brought the body of a dead man to the site of the found crosses and placed him upon each one. As he was placed on the True Cross, the man was restored to life. News spread and believers gathered to venerate the True Cross. Saint Helena commissioned a church to be built over the site, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (consecrated on September 13, 335).

The Patriarch of Jerusalem lifted the cross, "exalting" it for all to see. We, too, can lift high the cross in our daily lives, and by doing so you and I are saying, "yes" to Jesus. To follow Christ, often means sacrifice and self-denial. In sacrificing something of value too, we do so because of God and for someone else. God sacrificed his only son because he loved us. So, too, must we love others the way God loves us.

As an infant or an adult, we were given the Sign of the Cross at our Baptism. As children our parents took our hand and made the Sign of the Cross for us. As adults we make the Sign of the Cross as a profession of our faith in the Holy Trinity, and in the passion of Jesus Christ. This gesture remains with us as long as we draw breath on this earth. Even if we grow weary and weak because of age or illness, someone will come and again hold our right hand, lift it to our forehead and help us sign ourselves saying, *"In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."*
