My Dear Parish Family,

The final sign of “*The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic*,” is *evangelization*. In previous letters, we have seen how 7% of the Catholic population, that is truly engaged in their faith, have four things in common – disciplines of prayer, study, generosity and the passion to evangelize. What fuels that passion to share their faith? I think it is because those who evangelize have pondered the question “What is the best way to live my life?” and their prayer and study has provided an answer that they are passionate about sharing.

When surveyed, the 7% who are the engaged Catholics, admitted that their ability to effectively evangelize was the “weakest part of their game.” In their own self-assessment, they rated their faithfulness in prayer, study and generosity at 6.8 out of 10 but their evangelization rates only a 4.9. Even for these engaged Catholics, evangelization does not come easy. When asked who had the most influence on their spiritual life, most pointed to Pope Saint John Paul II. Fair enough, but later when asked to name a great evangelist, only a small number listed this newly ordained saint. No one in the history of the world has proclaimed the Gospel to more people, yet few think of him as an evangelist!

This fourth sign is truly a product of the development of the first three signs. Prayer and study open our eyes to wisdom, beauty, logic and the truth of our faith as they draw us closer to Christ Jesus. The practice of generosity molds us in the likeness of Christ-like other-centered love. When we allow ourselves to be led through this progression, we find ourselves living our lives the way God intended us to live them and this – living in accord with God’s will – brings us joy.

This joy is too big to keep to ourselves and this is what will fuel our passion to evangelize.

The important thing to remember is that this is not a one-time event. We must *continually* be “won over” by Christ’s love for us – that is to continually be evangelized ourselves before we can be built up into a useful tool to be used to reach out to those around us.

If you have read this far into this letter, then I think you know the answer to the question of “What is the best way to live?” The challenge before us is to take the steps toward living the answer and then sharing the joy in what we have found.
