Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. This is the Cathedral Church of Rome, originally consecrated in the year 324. Over its many centuries of existence, this structure has experienced fires and earthquakes and damage, along with the natural elements that wear on a building. Each time, it was rebuilt with care to ensure that it would remain “destined to render praise to God [and] invite us human beings too, though sinful, to convert ourselves to form...a well-ordered construction, in close communion with Jesus, who is the true Holy of Holies.” (Saint John Paul II).

This celebration is not simply about a building that has stood for almost 1,700 years. Rather, it celebrates the Mystical Body of Christ, all of us, who bring the Church to life. The building itself is just stone, but the Presence of God makes it holy and the living stones, the people of God, who worship and give thanks to God within it, bring it to life. We hope for this within every church dedicated to the faith; that within its walls, sinful human beings effect conversion and draw closer to Christ.

We especially hope for this in our parish community of Holy Rosary. Within our church building, now 106 years old, many have undergone conversion to a closer communion with Jesus. Through the celebration of the sacraments or times of prayerful reflection, those who walk into Holy Rosary, sense the Presence of God in their midst and open themselves to receiving God’s grace, which is the only possible way to conversion. As a parish, we are called to remain committed to remaining living stones for one another as we respond to the spiritual needs of this community. We are called to help each other grow in closer communion to Jesus.

The job of conversion is a continuing one; it will only be complete when our Lord returns. Until then, our charge is to remain steadfast in preserving a faith community focused on the person of Jesus Christ and which continuously longs to grow closer to Him. Let us ask Mary, the mother of Jesus, to assist us in drawing closer to her Divine Son as we journey in faith toward our Eternal Destiny.
