My Dear Parish Family:

Last Saturday evening we celebrated the Vigil Mass for All Souls, focusing on those men and women who died in the past year and were either buried from Holy Rosary or remembered in a Memorial Mass. Each person for whom we prayed left a legacy of themselves in the lives they lived. They were ordinary people: mothers, fathers, husbands, wives, sons, aunts, uncles, brothers and cousins, but they left in the hearts of those who loved them extraordinary memories.

In this week's readings we witness three men and a woman who are given particular missions to fulfill. In Proverbs we meet a woman whose focus is on the *other*. She creates a loving home for her husband and extends that love to those in need. She fears the Lord in a positive way because in her wisdom she has entrusted her life in God and is willing to follow Him in all that she does.

We meet three men – servants in Matthew's Gospel who were challenged by their master to build upon gifts that were given to them. One of the three, out of fear of his master, buried his gift in the ground and failed to reap any good fruit.

The master is God and the woman and the three servants are the men and women we prayed for on All Souls, and they are you and I. We have all been entrusted with gifts from God, but to recognize them we must first acknowledge His love for us and, like the woman in Proverbs, trust Him to lead our way. It takes courage and faith to trust. To invest in the talent that God has given us is a risk, but if we just bury it and never allow it to grow, we'll never know what His plan was for us; we can never really be part of building His kingdom.

Every family that came to plan their loved one's funeral liturgy spoke about the mother who showered her children and grandchildren with wonderful Sunday and holiday meals, the delicious sauce, Christmas cookies; the father who was strict but loving, hard working, and raised his children to be responsible men and women; the son who imitated his own father in raising his children with care and love; a cousin, an aunt, an unclethe litany of goodness, generosity and most of all love were the memories shared. Their gifts were not buried, but multiplied in how they lived and the choices they made.

How are we investing in God's gift to us? How are we helping to build God's kingdom here and now? Are we willing to risk all that the secular world offers and give ourselves totally to God and allow Him to guide our way? Let's not bury what our Lord has given. We owe that to those who will one day speak on our behalf. We may all be ordinary people, but in the eyes of God we are special. Whatever we do in His name, may we do it with extraordinary love.

Holy Rosary Culture of Life Ministry

The Gospel of Life....

“...there exists in contemporary culture a certain Promethean attitude which leads people to think that they can control life and death by taking the decisions about them into their own hands.....We see a tragic expression of all this in the spread of *euthanasia*--disguised and surreptitious, or practiced openly and even legally. As well as for reasons of a misguided pity at the sight of the patient’s suffering, euthanasia is sometimes justified by the utilitarian motive of avoiding costs which bring no return and which weigh heavily on society. Thus it is proposed to eliminate malformed babies, the severely handicapped, the disabled, the elderly, especially when they are not self-sufficient, and the terminally ill.”

...in the World

This past August, the High Court of England decided to allow Charlotte Fitzmaurice to end the life of her severely disabled 12-year-old daughter Nancy. Charlotte Fitzmaurice had given up work to care for her daughter full time, who required round the clock care. Nancy was unable to talk, walk or even eat and drink and had been born blind. Medications, fluids and nutrition were administered via tube feeding. **The case made legal history as it was the first time that a child NOT on life support, able to breathe independently, and NOT suffering from a terminal illness was allowed to die** in Great Britain. After being deprived of nutrition and fluids, Nancy died October 21.
