My Dear Parish Family,

On this Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, our Holy Father Francis has initiated the beginning of the “*Year of Consecrated Life – Wake up the World!*” In this coming year, our Holy Father challenges those already living a consecrated life to deepen their commitment to the vows they have already taken and to “shake up” the world by their radical witness to Gospel through the charisms of their community. He has also challenged the laity to pray for those serving the Body of Christ through a form of consecrated life and (this is the most challenging portion) to open our hearts and minds to vocations to consecrated life within our families and even for ourselves.

When I speak of consecrated or “religious life,” I refer to the religious sisters, brothers, friars, monks and priests who have taken vows of poverty, chastity and obedience as well as particular vows pertaining to their particular community for the purpose of serving and building the Kingdom of God. My life has been greatly blessed by such individuals. I refer to the Filippini sisters who taught at Holy Rosary and also the brothers and priests of the Society of Mary who taught me and later taught with me at Cathedral Latin. I also give thanks for the priests and brothers of Holy Cross with whom I served while teaching at St. Edward High School. I know that all of Holy Rosary joins me in giving thanks to God for the gifts the Sisters of Notre Dame shared with us in the persons of Sr. Ann Isabella and Sr. Trina Livignano. I know that my encounters with these self-donating people played a part in my discernment to my vocations as a husband and a deacon.

This “*Year of Consecrated Life*” is not only about giving thanks for blessings received, but also to think anew about our openness to consecrated life. It begins in each of us by renewing our own radical commitment to our Baptismal promises and to building the Kingdom. We cannot moan and complain about the lack of vocations to religious life if our prayers have the selfish tone that says, “Oh Lord, please increase vocations in your Church with *other people’s children, not mine.*” I admit that I am as anxious as the next person to be a grandparent, but if one of our remaining unmarried children are called to religious life, then who am I to interfere with them answering the call to consecrated life? Let us continue our prayers for vocations and for those already in religious life so that they may “*Wake up the World!*”
