My Dear Parish Family:

As we say goodbye to the Christmas season and embark on the beginning of Ordinary Time, we also begin our systematic, somewhat chronological reading of the mission of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Today's gospel contains a five-word message that most appropriately bridges that transition from the mystery of the Incarnation to the opening of Our Lord's public ministry. St. John the Baptist declares to his disciples and to us: ***Behold, the Lamb of God!***

***Behold*** is much more commanding that "hey, look over here" or "check this out." ***Behold*** means be prepared to be in awe and wonder at what you are about to gaze upon. This word commands you to look upon someone or something that will have a great impact upon you. ***Behold*** implies that what you are about to see is, like the Magi, something you have been seeking and for which you have longed for some time.

***The***, with a "long e" sound as in *thee* or as in the way one pronounces the name of the school of the national champions of NCAA football, "**THE** Ohio State University." Pronounced in this fashion, the article states that what follows is unique and not one among many. This is the genuine, singular one.

***Lamb*** is of course the animal that is synonymous with sacrifice for the Jewish people. The lamb was to be pure, unblemished and offered in reparation for the sins of the people. It was their Passover meal (the pasch), which they ate prior to their deliverance from the slavery of Egypt. Jesus is the Paschal Lamb. Assigning this title to Jesus at the beginning of His ministry foreshadows how His earthly mission will climax near its end – in sacrifice.

***Of God*** – This unique sacrifice that St. John commands us to behold is God's sole possession but God chooses to give Him unto us. We are gifted with His presence among us in order to save us.

It is no coincidence that these very words are spoken at every celebration of the Paschal Mystery of Christ that is the Mass. Prior to our reception of Holy Communion, we are reminded that Jesus is every bit as present and more accessible to us today than He was during His mortal life. When next you participate in Mass, look upon with awe and wonder Him for whom you longed, **the** one and only sacrifice that was given to us by God.

***Behold, the Lamb of God!***

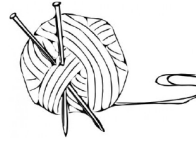
**Confirmation at Holy Rosary**
