**IMPORTANT RENOVATION REMINDER**

*Work on the church building continues!*

Just a reminder that **all Masses will be held in the hall** during the renovation process and we thank you for your patience during this time. Please note that the hall will be unlocked a half-hour before all Mass times.

My Dear Parish Family:

Soon after December 25th, Christmas cards and decorations are removed from store shelves and are immediately replaced with Valentine cards, flowers, candy...whatever fad the marketplace decides to use this year to imply "*romantic love of someone special.*" For many, advertising plays a big role in how people perceive one should live, and when that "fairy tale" is not realized, heartbreak can often overshadow the beauty and potential of "*a true and sincere love centered in God.*"

In today's second reading, Saint Paul speaks in a time when Christians believed that Jesus was about to return in glory at any moment. Saint Paul preached that because there was little time, people should remain unmarried so they could focus on the Lord minus the distractions imposed by a family. If you read this entire chapter, Paul is not condemning marriage, on the contrary. He writes in verse 17: "*Only, everyone should live as the Lord has assigned, just as God called each one.*" We know that men and women who have entered into a marital covenant in the Catholic Church are living a sacrament instituted by Christ. Men who have responded to God's call to the priesthood or diaconate are living the sacrament of Holy Orders. Those who hear the Lord's call to the religious life formally profess vows committing their lives to Christ.

What about the single man or woman? Where do they fit in society and more importantly, in the life of the Church? Some are single for a short while – others for a lifetime. Society has us believing that if two people are a "couple," even if it means cohabitating without benefit of marriage, it's alright...always emphasizing the "other." For the men and women who are unmarried or do not have a "significant other," it takes strength and courage to walk a path that can only emanate from the Spirit of God. It is in the Spirit that our hearts and minds are illuminated with God's will for us to serve and love Him without distraction. It is only in the Spirit that we can share our gifts of love and service to a multitude of men, women and children and remain one with Christ our Lord. It is in the Spirit that allows us to authentically give witness to the Gospels in the work place and social settings. Living a single life is a wonderful gift, but it often takes time, prayer and humility to acknowledge God's generosity. The reasons for being single are particular to each person, but you can be assured that God's hand was in the mix, calling that person to serve Him, and Him alone.

The next time you walk through a store in the next couple of weeks and see all the Valentine's Day paraphernalia, let's take time to remember that God loves all of us, regardless of our state in life, in very special and individual ways. May we return our love and thanksgiving to Him in the love we share with our neighbors, and even give someone who would least expect it a flower or card expressing how special they are.
