PENTECOST SUNDAY MAY 24, 2015

My Dear Parish Family:

After this weekend, the Paschal Candle will be moved to the side near the baptismal font and will no longer be lit during Mass symbolizing the conclusion of the Easter Season. This seasonal change relating to the symbol of the Light of Christ does not, as Fr. Joe proclaimed last week, mean that Christ has abandoned us, but rather that His presence among us going forward will take on new forms. Jesus ascended to the Father's right hand to make way on that first Pentecost for the Holy Spirit - our Advocate, guide and our strength. It is this solemnity we recall and celebrate today.

It is to the event described in our first reading (Acts 2:1-1) that we attribute the "birth" of the Church. This happened when "the time of Pentecost was fulfilled," that "they were all in one place together." The Jewish feast of Pentecost came 50 days after Passover and was designated to celebrate the event of the Law being handed down to Moses at Mr. Sinai. On this day, in this year, the inspired author of that Law, the Holy Spirit descends upon the disciples of the fulfillment of the Law - our Lord Jesus. These apostles were all in one place, waiting patiently and obediently to the Lord's instructions. The Spirit came in power with power to deliver to individuals! This power is not granted to maintain the status quo. The power of the Spirit induces change.

If we consider the apostles' frame of mind as they waiting in that room together, we may find it similar to our own. Jesus is not present to us in the ways in which we are accustomed. This makes us fearful and timid. We are not so sure what God wants of us going forward. What we learn from this event is that in these most vulnerable moments, God acts with power. BAM! The fire of the Holy Spirit falls! The meek are transformed into the bold. The stammering timid apostles become ultra-eloquent speakers understood in every language present.

On this Solemnity of Pentecost, our charge as individuals and as the Catholic faith community in this vibrant urban center is to allow the fire to fall on all the decisions that impact our growth. Seek the wisdom of the Holy Spirit as we consider our individual growth in holiness, the discernment of our vocation and the growth of our parish – each in accord with God's providential plan. Be prepared for change. Once the fire falls, standing pat is not an option.
