Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, we celebrate the Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity. It is fitting that after coming out of the Easter season into Ordinary Time; we first celebrate who God is: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. While this mystery of three persons in one God is beyond our comprehension, the attributes of God that it reveals help us to understand both God and ourselves better and how God calls us to live and love.

It is important first to reflect on what God reveals to us in sacred Scripture about the Godhead. In the First letter of John, we are told that “*God is love*” (1 Jn 4:8) and that “*In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins*” (1 Jn 4:10). So, it is really God who initiates this love and it is so great that the entirety of creation springs forth from this outpouring of love within the Trinity. It is this love within the Divine Persons that is our model for loving one another as Jesus loves us. It is therefore impossible for us to love without first acknowledging the source of our ability to love – God. It is that love from the Spirit which then enables us to share it in the many facets of our lives. Whether that is married love, celibate love, love between parents and children, or love between friends, they all stem from the Trinity’s infinite, unconditional love for each of us.

Taking this to a concrete level and learning how to love as God does, we look to St. Paul for guidance. The First Letter to the Corinthians explains love better than anything else; which is why it is chosen so often in marriage celebrations. Before describing the attributes of love (which are the attributes of God), Paul first reminds us that without love (without God) we are nothing. This reminds us that any merely human achievement without God is meaningless.

And what are the attributes of love (of God) that Paul mentions? First that love is patient and kind. Are we always? God certainly is with us throughout human history. What is not love? It is not jealous, pompous, inflated, rude, seeking its own interests, quick-tempered, or brooding over injuries. Do we avoid these things? If not, what changes do we need to make to have God within us more deeply? Again, Jesus displayed none of these things that love is not. Finally love rejoices with the truth, bears everything that may happen, never loses hope, and endures always. Do we allow the worries and struggles of our lives and the perceived injustices to weigh us down? If so, it is a sure sign of our need to turn toward God (toward love) in a deeper way. And Paul’s most accurate attribute: “*Love never fails*” (1 Cor 13:8a). God never fails. Of this we can be most certain. Everything we have celebrated in the Paschal Mystery reminds us of this. Today, then, let us be grateful that the Trinity exists.
