My Dear Parish Family:

How often have you prayed for healing, for yourself or another? In our asking we anxiously wait for a miracle, just like the two we witness in today's Gospel: the raising of Jairus' daughter from death, and the healing of the woman hemorrhaging. As we all know, and have experienced, physical healing is not always realized. So, then, how could a good God allow suffering and death?

Mary, a woman now in her fifties and afflicted with cerebral palsy, has lived her entire life wearing leg braces and eventually confined to a wheel chair. Mary knows suffering well and readily admits there are times when she questions God asking "how much more?" Despite her down times, Mary says that it is her faith and the Church that have become the foundation for her existence.

Melody, a seven-year old child, fell to the floor unconscious as a result of a medical condition. Due to her loss of oxygen, she was declared brain dead. Melody, a precocious child, had no problem taking leadership among her classmates. She enjoyed drama class, bright colors and aspired to be a doctor for astronauts in space. Family, friends and strangers prayed unceasingly for Melody's recovery. Melody's funeral Mass was held at Holy Rosary just two weeks ago.

"Illness and suffering have always been among the gravest problems confronted in human life" (CCC 1500). Sickness does not affect only the body, but the entire human person including the soul. In the many Gospel stories of healing, Christ asks the sick to believe. The hemorrhaging woman persisted until she touched Him. Jairus, the synagogue official, would have looked down upon Jesus as an outsider with dangerous teachings. Because he was in crisis, Jairus overlooked his prejudice, went to his knees and personally pled with Jesus to save his daughter. Jesus' compassion drew him to Jairus and the woman. He does the same for us today. But Jesus did not heal all the sick. Jesus' healings were signs of what was to come in His Father's Kingdom. It was in His Passion that Jesus gave His life to bring victory over sin and death. On the cross, Christ took upon Himself the whole weight of evil and took away the "sin of the world," of which illness is only a consequence (CCC 1505). Because of His selflessness, we can now share, through our suffering, in His redemptive Passion.

We don't know why Mary wasn't healed of cerebral palsy or Melody's life miraculously saved. What I do know is that Mary has touched the hearts of many, including children at Rainbow, Babies and Children Hospital, during her volunteer times with them. Mary's life in faith has and will continue to be an inspiration to all who come in contact with her.

Melody's wish was to be a doctor. In Father Joe's homily for Melody, he said that she was in fact the greatest doctor. You see, six children were given the gift of Melody's organs...among them a child who was blind and can now see, and a child whose heart was failing, who will one day run and play.

Why does God allow suffering and death...I don't know that anyone really knows the answer. What I do believe is that He does not cause bad things to happen, and if we continue to pray for our infirmed brothers and sisters (and ourselves) asking for *His will to be done*, He will affect healing upon the person for whom we pray *in His way*.

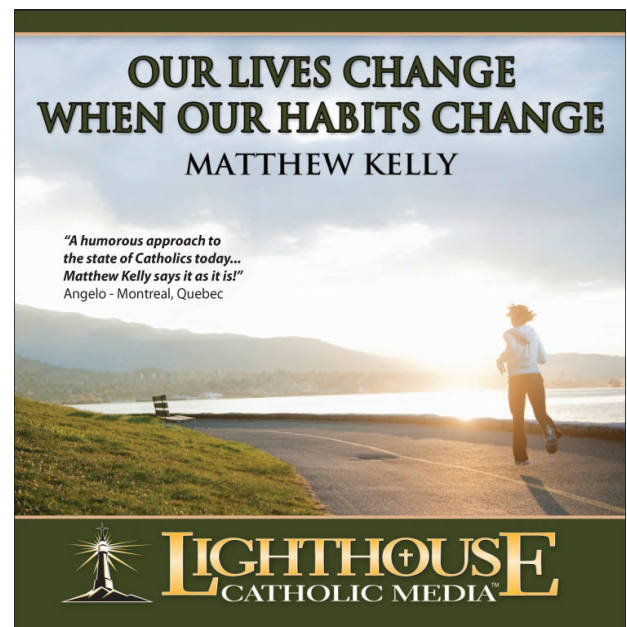

WCCR – New Cleveland Catholic Radio Station

A new Catholic radio station is now on the air serving greater Cleveland. Located at 1260 AM on the dial, WCCR (Cleveland Catholic Radio) will be identified as 1260 – the Rock. It is operated by St. Peter the Rock Media, a local entity. It will initially feature programming from EWTN Satellite Radio network with expectation that local programming will follow. This is a listener-supported station. All programs will be faithful to the Sacred Scripture, the Catechism, the Magisterium and Sacred tradition.
