As we enter into this second week of Advent and our new liturgical year, we also begin the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy this coming week on December 8th, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In declaring this Jubilee Year, only the fourth Extraordinary Jubilee in the history of the Church, our Holy Father Pope Francis proclaimed that "this is the time for mercy. A time to heal wounds…a time to offer everyone the way of forgiveness and reconciliation."

The Pope will open the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica on December 8th to begin the year of mercy. In our diocese, Bishop Lennon will conduct the Rite of Opening the Holy Door at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist on Sunday, December 13th at 10:15 a.m. The opportunities for us to enter through the doors of God's mercy will be plentiful this coming year. Let us take advantage of them.

Jubilee years date back to Old Testament times in the Book of Leviticus when the people of Israel were called to celebrate them every 50 years as a time of reflecting on God's blessings to them. These jubilees required mercy on the part of the people—remitting debts, liberating servants, and prohibiting sowing or reaping of the land. It was a reminder that God provides for His people.

So, too, our Christian Jubilee years offer us a special time to respond more deeply to the call to conversion of heart; it is a time of reconciliation with others and for ourselves through the Sacrament of Penance. As St. Faustina reminds us in her *Diary*, Jesus is "prolonging the time of mercy for the sake of [sinners].... Before the Day of Justice I am sending the Day of Mercy." And so, this jubilee year offers us the opportunity to experience the mercy of God while extending that mercy to others.

- To do this, Pope Francis suggests specific ways for us to celebrate the year of mercy:
- Spend time meditating on Sacred Scripture, especially the Sunday readings for Mass
- Make a pilgrimage to the Holy Door at the Cathedral or other designated place
- Make a special effort to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance (confession) regularly during this year—monthly, to establish a deeper sense of God's mercy
- Forgive those who have hurt or wronged you in the past, even if long ago
- Make an effort to perform a corporal or spiritual work of mercy each day
- Pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy each day for the needs of mercy for the world

Share God's mercy with others through how we live each day. As we enter this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy, let us recognize the importance of God's mercy toward us and allow it to transform us into Disciples of Christ who extend the mercy He gained for us on the Cross.

Year of Mercy—Opening of the Holy Door Liturgy, Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist

Holy Father Pope Francis has declared a *Jubilee Year of Mercy* celebration for the year beginning December 8, 2015, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, concluding on Sunday, November 20, 2016. Since the 15th Century, a Holy Door has been used as a ritual expression of conversion during Jubilee Years. Those who traveled to a cathedral or a basilica or a designated church for reconciliation entered through the Holy Door, crossing the threshold from sin to grace, from slavery to freedom and from darkness to light. The Holy Door is a tangible symbol and invitation to follow Christ, leaving sin behind and crossing the threshold into the light of Grace. The opening of the Holy Doors of Mercy for the Diocese of Cleveland will take place at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist at 10:15 a.m. on December 13, 2015, just prior to the celebration of the 10:30 a.m. Mass. The faithful will be welcomed to come and cross over the threshold to experience God's mercy. Parking will be available in the Cathedral surface lot (enter off Superior Ave.) and the Rockwell Avenue parking garage.
