My Dear Parish Family,

As summer begins so we resume our liturgical sojourn through Ordinary Time and with it we hear in today's second reading about St. Paul's résumé and credentials as an apostle. In his opening words he proclaims, "*The gospel preached by me is not of human origin.*" In more contemporary language he might have said, "You can't make this stuff up. This is the real deal!" He goes on to affirm that he is not a disciple of one of the Apostles but that he is an actual apostle of the Lord Jesus having received the Gospel by direct revelation. He continues with his impressive résumé as a leader of all things Jewish – tradition, law and enforcement of his interpretation of that law. At the onset of the infant church, Saul was the formidable foe of all followers of "The Way" (as disciples of Jesus were first known). With such training and the backing of the Sanhedrin and the Romans, it would appear that Saul was perfectly suited to squash this "rebellion." But God had another plan in mind for this man we now know as Paul, the Apostle.

God's plan was to transform this passion Paul had for his Jewish heritage and his academic training into a passion for Jesus, the Messiah, the fulfillment of all things Jewish. St. Paul would begin by preaching this gospel to his Jewish people, trying to "remove the veil" from their eyes so that they would "see" Jesus as the answer to God's promise. After limited success it was revealed to St. Paul that something even more unbelievable was in store for his ministry. God "*was pleased to reveal his Son to me, so that I might proclaim him to the Gentiles.*"

How unexpected that St. Paul, this "Super-Jew," would become the vessel used to bring the gospel to us Gentiles! This gospel tells of Jesus who performed amazing miracles like raising the only son of the widow of Nain from the dead.

This gospel demonstrates that Jesus is the fulfillment of the covenant, our path to eternal life.

This news is indeed good. It is divine. *You can't make this stuff up.*
