My Dear Parish Family,

You will recall that "*The Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic*" are **Prayer, Study**, acts of **Generosity** and **Evangelization**. In this letter I would like to share some thoughts on the second of these, study.

The discipline of study for a disciple of Christ is a lifelong, never-ending activity. It was found that like prayer, the *engaged Catholics* had a routine, a regular daily schedule of time set aside to learn more about their Catholic faith. In fact, it was found that engaged Catholics, on average, spend about 14 minutes per day reading or listening to something to grow their knowledge of the faith. It is true that the religious education for most American Catholics ceased with their last sacramental preparation. Because of this many Catholics have an inferiority complex when it comes to explaining their faith. This is one reason why study is so important.

These engaged Catholics realize that our Catholic faith is deep and very complex but it also logical and comprehensible. For these 7%, however, the continuous exploration of the faith within the scriptures, traditions and teachings of the Church is a lifelong habit that feeds their faith. The more they know about their faith, the more meaningful the prayers, devotions and charitable works become. Their study takes the form of reading solid Catholic periodicals, books or newsletters. This is something that is within reach for all of us regardless of our educational background. How else can we grow in holiness if we do not grow in our understanding of our faith and how can we grow in that understanding if we do not study?

For many years now, the Men's Group here at Holy Rosary have collectively selected and read a good Catholic book that fed and expanded our faith. We meet on a monthly basis to pray and discuss the book with powerful results. I do not exaggerate when I say that it has changed the lives of several men. I mention this to emphasize that it is within anyone's ability to do this. I challenge you to commit to reading 5 pages per day of a good material with a solid Catholic foundation. Even if you could only commit to 25 pages per week, that would translate to 6 or 7 books in a given year. Imagine how this would impact your confidence in what you believe!

When next I write I will share a great story that will exemplify the third sign, *generosity*.

Note: There will not be a 7:00 p.m. Mass on October 13th.

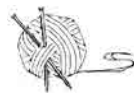
Holy Rosary Choir Invitation!
