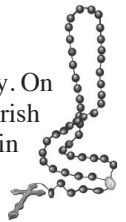

My Dear Parish Family:

In the autumn of the year, we lavish in the beautiful, vibrant colors of the leaves – bright oranges, yellows and reds. We're gifted with days soaked in warm breezes and sun-filled blue skies. During this time of change in season, even rainy days can give us a sense of quiet peace. It can be a time to remember a life lived, and a time to walk in the midst of the beauty and learn about that life. Can you imagine walking alongside our Blessed Mother Mary on a Fall day, rustling through the leaves and listening as she shares precious memories of her life with her Son, Jesus?

Mary's *precious memories* are given to us in the oldest and most cherished Marian devotion, the Rosary. The origin of the Rosary is vague, but what is known is that the use of prayer beads and the continuous recitation of prayers to enhance meditation began in the earliest days of the Church. When the Church prayed the 150 psalms, uneducated people substituted by praying 150 Our Fathers (Paternosters in Latin) on beads. In the twelfth century, when the *Hail Mary* was formed, people began praying this prayer instead of the Our Father on most of the beads. Eventually, 50 *Hail Marys* were prayed and linked with verses of psalms or other phrases pertaining to the lives of Jesus and Mary. In the sixteenth century, the five-decade Rosary with three mysteries evolved: the Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious. In 2002, then Pope John Paul II added a fourth set, the Luminous Mysteries.

Tradition tells us that it was Saint Dominic who developed the Rosary, as we now know it; he had a vision of Our Lady who handed it to him. Many scholars refute this, but do say that he evangelized using the Rosary to convert sinners and those who strayed from the faith. Our Church has a beautiful depiction of Saint Dominic receiving this gift by our Blessed Mother in the statue above the back altar.

On October 7, the Catholic Church universally celebrates the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. Pope St. Pius V instituted this feast in thanksgiving of a 16th Century naval victory over a Turkish invasion of Europe. Pope St. Pius V credited the victory to the intercession of Our Lady through the multitude of people praying the Rosary throughout Europe.

In today's second reading, Saint Paul tells that we are to have no anxieties; by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, we are to make our petitions known to God. I think most of us will agree we have much to pray for in our world. *October is "Right to Life" month* and is also dedicated to the Holy Rosary. We must pray for the most vulnerable in our society: the child in the womb, the imprisoned, the elderly, mentally and physically challenged, the forgotten and abandoned. The terror of war, violence in our homes – the list of evil acts are many, but we must remember the power of the Rosary. Saint Pio said "*Love the Madonna and pray the Rosary, for her Rosary is the weapon against the evils of the world today.*"

Take time and walk alongside our Lady, whether it be in the autumn of the year, winter, spring or summer, and pray with her the memories she carries in the depth of her heart. With each bead we pray upon, we can be assured that our Mother Mary brings us closer to her Son, Jesus Christ.

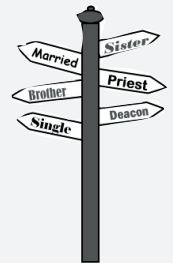
