Dear Parish Family,

Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen! Alleluia! This is the joyful acclamation of the Church as she rejoices in the triumph of Jesus over sin and death! So, today we, too, rejoice in what Christ's saving action has done for us who believe. There is no sadness this day. Our Lenten pilgrimage leads to our destiny – to share hopefully one day in the Resurrection of Jesus!

This year, we also give thanks for our beautifully renovated church in which we as a faith community sing God's praises for so great a Redeemer! We appreciate the patience of the entire parish family over these last 12 weeks of preparation and give thanks to all those who volunteered their time to help clean, decorate, and make our sacred worship space one that continues to provide us with a special place to deepen our relationship with the Risen Lord.

His act was one of total and unconditional love for us.

The Apostles reflect on the empty tomb as well and at first are not sure what it means. They will, however, become witnesses of the resurrection and hand down this great truth to the Church as they proclaim the gospel. Their absolute belief in the resurrection helps strengthen our belief and reminds us that no earthly power, difficulty, fear, or obstacle can separate us from the love of Christ and the power of His cross and resurrection.

Let it be our prayer that our entire parish experiences the joy of the resurrection in a most special way this Easter season and throughout our lives. On behalf of our entire parish staff, we wish you all a most blessed Easter Day and season! Buona Pasqua!

“On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I will pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy” (from the diary of St. Faustina, 699). 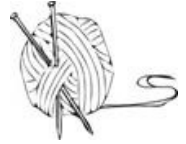
