My Dear Parish Family:

The *Just One*, the *Gentle and Merciful One*, the *child within* – are enlightening phrases that center on today's readings describing our journey if we are true disciples of Jesus Christ. The first reading from the Book of Wisdom, and Mark's Gospel speak of the *Just One* and the suffering he would encounter. The disciples, hearing Jesus' prophesy of his own betrayal and death, could not envision what they had just heard; in their minds, Jesus' purpose was about power to overcome the Roman rule.

Those of us who believe and follow Christ know the truth. There are those, like the disciples, who are afraid to know because if they do, their lives would have to change. Saint James very clearly tells us that jealousy, selfish ambitions, all passions focused on "me" and self-gratification only cause a war within us; there is no peace.

The disciples actually argued about who was greater. Are we any different? Society says that we must strive to be first....the best. We are taught at a young age that it's all about "survival of the fittest." But what does that really mean? Is that in tune with Jesus' teachings or does it follow the darkness of our society?

While addressing the disciples about who was the greatest, Jesus took a small child and placed him in a place of honor. (At that time children had no rights, position or privileges of their own; they were no better than the domestic servants and were at the service of their parents.) Placing the child next to him, Jesus explains that whoever serves this child is serving him. This child represents the powerless and those who have no great status in society.

While establishing his order of friars Saint Francis of Assisi asked God to give him a new and humble people who would serve in humility and poverty. God willed this for Saint Francis and they were called the "Little Brothers" or Friars minor. Saint Francis accepted those who were ordinary, the simple and if they were of noble heritage or intellectually advanced, they too, lived as "Little Brothers." On one occasion Saint Francis said to his community: "Let no one appropriate to himself the role of being over others," and quoted from Matthew 10:28, "I did not come to be served but to serve." He challenges us to let the child within us out into the sunlight. He challenges us to unchain ourselves from the need to control. Francis protected his followers from honors and status that would keep them from knowing the joy of being children of God. (Praying with Francis of Assisi)

Whatever number of years we live, life will be brief. Worrying about who is the greatest, who has more wealth, greater position, etc., is useless. If our goal is sincerely to live in eternity with God, His Mother and all the saints, then all that really matters is how we carry our crosses and how much love and gentle mercy did we give to the least of our brothers and sisters. May God give us the grace to follow him in *his* way of holiness.
