My Dear Parish Family:

Do you remember your Confirmation day? If it was pre-Vatican II, you probably recall the gentle tap on your cheek declaring us "*soldiers of Christ*"; we were called to *give witness to Jesus*, and to *continue his work*. This weekend the sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred upon eight teens here at Holy Rosary. Like many before them, these confirmandi will also be called to give witness and to serve.

How do we give witness to Christ effectively and sincerely... how is it possible to continue his work in a world that seems so foreign to these commands? In Luke's Gospel we witness the Spirit actively working in Jesus' life. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, and in his own synagogue, Jesus respectfully turned to the Book of Isaiah and read a passage proclaiming that, indeed, the Spirit of the Lord was upon him, he was *anointed* to tend to the poor, heal the blind, give liberty to captives, let the oppressed go free. Gifted by the Spirit, Jesus proclaimed that this passage from Isaiah was now fulfilled. Jesus understood that God had chosen him to give witness and to serve. The same Spirit has gifted us to know and understand that we, too, have been chosen to be builders of the kingdom of God.

In Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he reminds us of the importance of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Just as the Spirit called Jesus to new ministry, so now the Spirit is calling us. Every person is called to fulfill different roles, but Saint Paul's emphasis is that the source of our call is the *Spirit of God*. None of us can *live* this call alone. Through our Baptism, strengthened in Confirmation, and nourished in the Eucharist and in the Word, we *are* the body of Christ. United as one, the Spirit's gifts will bear much fruit for the sake of the kingdom.

The first reading from Nehemiah reminds us of God's gift to Israel, given through Moses, the Torah – the Law. Exiled in Babylon for many years, the Jewish community failed to keep observance of the Law, but upon their return, they renewed their fidelity to the covenant that gave them great joy. We also stray from God's Law, but when we're renewed through the sacrament of Reconciliation, and the burden of separation is lifted through God's mercy, we are again free to experience the fruits of the Spirit... joy and peace.

To give witness, service to others, fidelity to the covenant...these are the commands given in today's readings. Through Jesus and his Church we are given the tools; the Spirit gives us his gifts. God the Father gives us His unconditional love and mercy when we are faithful and even when we fail.

When some of us received that gentle tap on the cheek, we were sent to be "*soldiers for Christ*".... not as warriors, but as peacemakers, advocates for justice, people of mercy and love for all. As you and I walk our journey, may we unite with those newly confirmed, and respond to God's call through the Holy Spirit, as one body, and continue to build His Kingdom revealing the fruits of the Spirit along the way. Please continue to keep these young people in prayer.
