Lent Begins This Week

Ash Wednesday is February 10th. There will be a prayer service with distribution of ashes at 7:00 a.m. and Mass will be celebrated at 12:15 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. Both Masses include distribution of ashes.



Note that Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fasting applies to those 18-59 years of age (only one full meal during the day with two lighter meals and no eating between meals). Abstinence is abstaining from meat for those age 14 and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all Fridays of Lent.

We invite you to one hour of Eucharistic Adoration after the 12:15 p.m. Masses on all Fridays of Lent and to the Stations of the Cross on all Fridays of Lent at 7:00 p.m.

Dear Holy Rosary Parish family,

Hello from Deacon John, your weekend seminarian! Father Previte asked me to share a few thoughts this week as we journey toward the Lenten season, with Ash Wednesday coming this Wednesday, February 10. First, however, I wanted to take this opportunity thank you for the wonderful, warm welcome you all have given me over the past three months as I began my ministry at Holy Rosary Parish! This is truly a unique, welcoming, and holy place!

We all know that Lent is a time of purification and conversion, calling us to reflect upon Jesus Christ's life, ministry, passion and death, and to rededicate ourselves to growing closer to Christ in preparation for the glorious celebration of His Resurrection on Easter Sunday. However, as each Ash Wednesday arrives, we Catholics often desire to find some new perspective, some new angle with which to challenge ourselves during Lent.

This year, the entire Church is called by our Holy Father, Pope Francis, to "go deep" and walk more closely with Christ in the field of mercy, reflecting upon the meaning of God's abundant mercy toward each of us, and discerning where we need to show mercy to others (both individually, and as a community of faith). We will be hearing a lot about mercy over the coming weeks, as we progress during this Jubilee Year of Mercy. So, you might ask, "Deacon John, what new perspective can you provide on mercy during Lent?"

Well, I don't know if this is entirely new, but perhaps we can begin Lent by reflecting on two ideas: First, we can only give away during Lent what we have already been given by God our Father; and second, the mercy we receive from God isn't something we "earn." You see, God's mercy always takes the first step in our lives. God desires to show us His love, no matter how much we stray from Him. God's mercy is His steadfast love that never gives up. We see this in the parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). Also, just ask His only Son, Jesus, our Risen Lord, about the Father's saving love! But if we are not aware of God's mercy in our own lives, how can we give it away to others during Lent? For example, how often do we take time out of our busy schedules to think about how utterly dependent we are on God for our health, our family and friends, or our successes and material blessings? When do we take time to ask God, and thank Him, for His help in those parts of our lives that are less loving, less successful, and more in need of mercy? It seems like one of the most serious habits or faults we could "give up" for Lent is our tendency to forget to acknowledge God's mercy in our lives. So, before we give up chocolate (or fast food), fast, or go out to do mercy this Lent, let us resolve to take time out every day – five minutes, ten minutes, or even a "holy hour" – and reflect upon God's overflowing love which supports us in all that we are and do. Saint John says, "God loved us first" (1 John 4:10). Don't forget to thank God for his mercy this Lent!
