Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday, we enter into Holy Week, the most sacred time of the entire liturgical year. We conclude the Lenten Season and enter into the Sacred Paschal Triduum of our Lord's suffering, death, and resurrection. If there is ever a time for us to recognize and realize who we are as Catholic Christians, it is during the liturgies of this coming week. This is the week during which we commemorate the "hour" of Jesus, when He saves sinful humanity and reconciles all to the Father by the sacrifice on the Cross.

This week defines us. We, who have shared in Christ's death through baptism, await our share in His glorious Resurrection. It is what our lives are all about and the focus on how we live out each day. If we truly desire to follow Christ, then we have to take up our cross each day and know that doing so is the only way to share in the resurrection.

On this Palm Sunday, we recall the Lord's entry into Jerusalem, where the people all hailed Him. In a few short days, He would be handed over to crucifixion. But that is not the end of the story, nor is it that simple. In that week, Jesus gave us the memorial of His sacrifice – the Eucharist – which we celebrate as the new and everlasting covenant. Through His Paschal Mystery, all the sacraments of the Church have their beginning, as does the Church herself. In the Resurrection, Christ ushers in the final age in His victory over sin and death. Therefore, there is nothing for us to fear in this life, if we truly believe in the power of Christ's victory.

So, as we continue our pilgrimage this week toward the heavenly kingdom, let us allow ourselves to enter more deeply into the saving events we commemorate. Let us allow them to become real for us – as they are – and transform us more and more into disciples of Jesus Christ.

Let us not let this week pass us by as just another of the 52 weeks in the year. It is special; it is holy for good reason. Let us pause, slow down and enter into it. Let us reflect upon the events we commemorate. If we believe we are too busy to do that, then the reality is that we are too busy with the wrong things. So, let us set aside those activities that are not really important this week and center our attention as much as possible on what really matters – the saving events of our Savior Jesus Christ.

**Lent 2016 Report on Persecution of Christians  
Around the World & Prayer Request**

The latest extremist attacks against Christians in 2016 have come from an unlikely source: India. As Christianity has seemingly been under attack in places like Iraq, Syria, and Africa for over a decade from extremist groups, the first six weeks of 2016 have seen a fresh outbreak of anti-Christian violence in India, with nearly 30 incidents of religiously motivated violence against Christians reported in just over two months. According to various news reports, there have been twenty-six documented incidents of religiously motivated violence against Christians spread across the subcontinent since January 1, 2016. Incidents of violence against Christians have always existed in one form or another, but were usually limited to a particular region or issue. “Since 2014, there has been a significant increase in attacks on Christians and Christian communities in India,” (David Curry, president and CEO of Open Doors USA).
