My Dear Parish Family:

Every Sunday, one of Holy Rosary's homebound (and life long) parishioners waits for the Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion to visit with Holy Eucharist. Immediately following the reception of the Eucharist, in her own direct manner, *Betty leads* the minister in the following prayer, reciting it three times... "*O Sacrament most holy, O Sacrament divine, all praise and all thanksgiving be ever moment Thine.*"

Betty has been ill for a long while. Her journey for the past few years has not been easy, but just meeting her one would never know it. You see, her reception of the Holy Eucharist continues to transform Betty, bringing her closer to Jesus, and allowing her to never lose hope in the promises of eternal life, which begins every morning that she awakes and each night when she falls asleep.

In his homily on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (2013), Pope Francis questions that if in fact we adore Christ truly present in the Eucharist, do we allow ourselves to be transformed by Him? Our Holy Father said, "*The Eucharist is the sacrament of the communion that takes us out of our individualism so that together we live our discipleship, our faith in him.*" In Luke's Gospel, the disciples wanted Jesus to dismiss the crowd; the strangers in the crowd should search on their own for lodging and food. Instead, Jesus instructed the disciples to feed the people, and to divide the crowd of about five thousand into groups of fifty. Most likely in disagreement with Jesus, the disciples followed our Lord's command. Jesus prayed for His Father's blessing and the small amount of food became abundant...enough for all to eat. The disciple's solution was for everyone to take care of Himself. Pope Francis warns us that today's disciples and those of 2,000 years ago share in the same temptation: "*we don't take on the needs of others, but dismiss them with a compassionate 'May God help you' or a not-so-compassionate 'Good luck.'*" Jesus' resolve allowed the disciples to *remove themselves from their individualism and live their discipleship...to live their faith in Jesus Christ.* They built communities of fifty; no longer strangers, the disciples served and shared with the multitude the meal sent from heaven.

Our Holy Father speaks to each of us: "*Jesus shed his blood as a ransom and as a lavacrum – a cleansing agent, that we might be purified of all sins: in order that we fall not into cowardice, despair of sinfulness, that we not become weak, let us look to him, let us drink deep draughts from His source, that we might be preserved from the risk of corruption. Then shall we experience the grace of a transformation: we will remain always poor sinners, but the Blood of Christ will deliver us from our sins and give us back our dignity. Without merit of our own, with sincere humility, we can bring to our brethren the love of our Lord and Savior. We will be His eyes that go in search of Zacchaeus and of the Magdalene; we will be His hand that helps the sick in body and spirit; we will be His heart that loves those in need of reconciliation and understanding. Thus, does the Eucharist make present the Covenant that sanctifies us, purifies us and unites us in marvelous communion with God.*"

Like Betty, let's not lose hope. May you and I be transformed a little more each time we receive the Body and Blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ. **And, may we, the community of Holy Rosary, stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters who suffer because of their faith in Jesus Christ and who will not be sharing at the Table of the Lord on this Solemnity of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.**
