My Dear Parish Family:

It took great faith to respond to the question asked of Peter by Jesus....”*Who do you say that I am?*” Peter’s response that Jesus was truly the “*Christ of God*” could not have been revealed to him by anyone other than God Himself. Who is Jesus for each one of us? We have been taught that He *is* our Savior, but what does that really mean in the core of our hearts. Yes, He gave His life so we could have eternal life and did so by dying the worst possible death and did so selflessly. We can accept and even cherish what we know of Jesus, but who Christ *really* is for us is the challenge of Luke’s Gospel for each of us; it is an answer that must be given with an honest and sincere heart.

To respond to this profound question in such a manner we must first know and love our Lord above all else. Through the Holy Spirit, we are given the gift of faith to know Jesus as the Redeemer. It is the Spirit that enlightens us when we hear and meditate upon the scriptures that give us the words of Christ telling us how to live in this world as people of faith. To know Him is to selflessly follow His commands of loving our neighbor, giving attention to those who are ignored with compassion, mercy and love, and standing firm for what *He* preached to be right....not what the world teaches.

Saint Paul reminds us, as he did the people of Galatia, that through the sacrament of Baptism, we have become children of God. We were wrapped in the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ and became members of His Divine Family. Jesus is no longer someone in the distance that we learned about, but through our baptism, He now lives in you and me. He also lives in the souls of men, women and children suffering in impoverished nations and living under regimes of terror. He is one with the baptized man, woman or teen, who, through circumstances we will never know, has been condemned to prison for crimes committed. He is one with the young teenager who is contemplating aborting her baby or the young boy or girl who has been forced into a life of enslavement. Covered in Christ and transformed by Him, we **all** wear a common identity and that is Christ....the job we hold, where we’re from, the amount of money we carry in our pockets, the color of our skin or the language we speak is no longer relevant when we become members of *His* family. His love is given to all His children, equally and without conditions.

Jesus commanded us that if we wish to follow Him, that we must deny ourselves and take up our cross daily. At times this all this seems insurmountable. But, if we believe that it is the Holy Spirit who empowers us with dignity, courage and humility, then we can pick up the cross before us, and follow Jesus wherever He leads us. Then can we share in *His* victory of everlasting life.

Pray, accept the gifts of the Spirit in your life and be strengthened to accept what comes your way. Just as Simon of Cyrene helped Jesus carry His cross, as the *Body of Christ* we are mandated as Christians to selflessly help one another carry his or her cross, through our prayers and deeds. We are part of a greater family, one than we could never have imagined.
