My Dear Parish Family:

Of all the Christian virtues that we are called to pursue, humility is the most elusive. The nature of this virtue is such that as soon as one is certain that they have obtained it, they are in reality most distant from it. Today's scriptures, both from the gospel and the Hebrew scriptures, speak very powerfully regarding the value of this virtue in one's relationship with God and with each other.

The book of Sirach is representative of the collective Judaic wisdom writings of the 6th century before Christ. In our first reading we hear, "*My child, conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than a giver of gifts.*" You cannot "buy" your friends with gifts but you can endear yourself to them by conducting yourself with humility. Imagine how relationships would change if this principle was applied. Then we hear an exhortation that runs contrary to how we observe that the secular world works. "*Humble yourself the more, the greater you are, and you will find favor with God.*" To follow this advice means that our ego must shrink at the same rate that our greatness grows. Jesus said of St. John the Baptist that "there is none born of woman greater than he." St. John understood this principle because when he beheld the Lamb of God he said of Jesus, "He must increase and I must decrease." Imagine what our political scene would be if as a candidate rose to higher and higher levels of importance, their humility grew proportionately.

The gospel parable of the seating arrangements at a dinner party contains a different paradox. The scramble for the best seats in the house is really a matter of pride. Having a seat with a good view of the activities is not as important as *being viewed occupying a seat of importance!* In this jockeying for position of prestige, whether at a dinner party or in the eyes of the community, Jesus tells us that all our efforts will have the exact opposite effect of our intent. "*For every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.*" The harder you work to get noticed, the more you will be diminished. The greater your effort to remove yourself from the spotlight, the more the light of Christ will shine through you.

There is no greater example of how this paradox works than in the person of our Blessed Mother Mary. In the greatest of all humility she said "YES" to the will of God in her fiat, "*I am the handmaid of the Lord. Let it be done unto me according to your word.*" God could not have chosen a more humble tabernacle. As I write this the Church celebrates the memorial of the sovereignty of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth. There cannot be a more "exalted" title bestowed upon a human person, yet Mary is the most humble of servants.

Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary, pray for us!

Natural Family Planning

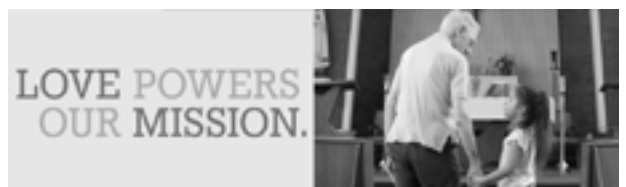

2016 Catholic Charities Appeal Update

Good news! The first seven months of this year have seen substantial support for the 2016 Catholic Charities Annual Appeal. As of July 31, 2016, \$11,444,667 has been pledged by 49,556 donors.
