My Dear Parish Family:

For just a few moments, stop whatever you are doing, quietly sit back and remember your First Holy Communion day. For some of us it may have been many years ago, for others, it may have been this past Easter Vigil. First Communion is one of those special days that lives within us; it is an event that we never forget.

This weekend, seven children will receive the Holy Eucharist for the first time here at Holy Rosary Church. These children were prepared and supported by their parents, dedicated teachers, catechists, and the parishioners of Holy Rosary. How did we, parishioners, teachers, and catechists, become their teachers and intercessors? What made their parents choose to have them receive the sacraments of the Catholic Church?

It doesn't matter who we are or what part we play in the lives of these children, what is important that we all recognize the Good Shepherd in our lives. HE is the *cornerstone* that picks us up, unconditionally, when we fall. When we have lost our confidence and lose our way, it is HE who builds us up to truly believe that each one of us is a son and daughter of God the Father. HE is the Good Shepherd who accepts you and me as one of HIS flock even with all of our flaws. The Shepherd knows HIS flock and the flock know the Shepherd. We need – we must know HIM; only then can we talk to HIM freely, open our hearts to HIM, and then be still and listen for HIM to speak to you and to me.

How else could we know that God has called us to assist those who have lost their way out of ignorance, been coerced or fell into a life that is not of God, or those who reject Jesus as our Savior? Through our baptism and confirmation, we are given a mandate from God, through the Holy Spirit, to give witness to the truth, that it is through the Good Shepherd – the cornerstone in our lives. It is through Jesus Christ that we will one day see the face of God, our Father.

The people involved in the lives of our communicants know their Shepherd, have listened, and with confidence answered the Father's call. These communicants will be called to receive the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. The children have been introduced to the Good Shepherd, they trust HIM and will receive HIM in the purest love that only a child can give.

The Good Shepherd laid down HIS life for HIS sheep; Jesus died for you and for me so death would be no more. We remember that special day when we received Jesus the very first time. May every day that we receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist be like our first time – a very special day. Allow HIM to be our cornerstone, our source of strength in all that we do and all that we are to be, according to HIS will.

One day, these seven children will be adults and will be asked to play some part in a child's life as they receive First Eucharist. When they are asked to be a mom or dad, a teacher, a catechist or an intercessor, may they never forget this day – their special day when they became one with God in the Holy Eucharist.

My love and congratulations to all the parents, teachers, and catechists for their hard work and loving example given to each child.
