My Dear Parish Family,

As we resume the Sundays of Ordinary Time our readings today take us back to the beginning – to the Garden of Eden. The first reading picks up the story after the serpent has beguiled Eve disobeying God’s command and convincing Adam to join her. The earlier passage states that as they ate of the fruit, “their eyes were opened.” They “see” that they have been duped. They also see that they have betrayed the trust God had put in them. They realize that their relationship with God has become broken.

Their reaction to this realization is to try to make themselves invisible, that is to hide. (As if there were a place anywhere in the universe that God created that was inaccessible to the vision of God!) What Adam and Eve feel in this moment is captured in a word that has almost vanished from our modern vocabulary – **shame**. Yes, shame is what overcomes us when our conscience convinces us that we have somehow, in some way, have not been true to what we were created to be. This original shame of our parents is something we share with them by our human nature – Original Sin.

Although Adam and Eve feel the shame, in a familiar human tactic they attempt to deflect the blame. They are in need of forgiveness but they do not ask for it but offer only excuses for their poor behavior. God forgives them anyway. As we prayed in the Psalm, “**With the Lord there is mercy, and fullness of redemption.**” God already has a plan for their redemption and that plan is the offspring of the woman Mary, His only begotten Son, Jesus who will vanquish Satan by taking on our shame, our sin and putting death to death through His Paschal Mystery.

Too often today shame is considered old-fashioned, irrelevant or even damaging to the delicate psyche of one’s self-image. Like Adam and Eve, we are too ready to offer excuses why we behave poorly toward one another. – My dysfunctional family, my economic upbringing or being a victim of discrimination. In our all-out effort to avoid shame, we also, like Adam and Eve may become confused enough to perceive what is evil as good and what is good as evil. This is the blasphemy against the Holy Spirit of which Jesus speaks in the Gospel.

Perhaps **shame** needs to make a comeback. Let the Holy Spirit speaking through a well-formed conscience be our guide. “*Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me a sinner.*”

**Holy Rosary Tuition Assistance
2018-2019 School Year**

The Diocese of Cleveland encourages parishes who do not operate a Catholic School to provide assistance for children whose families are registered at that parish to attend a Catholic elementary school. This program subsidizes an amount sufficient to cover the difference between parishioner and non-parishioner tuition rates at area Catholic grade schools and allows families to remain active parishioners of their home parish. Father Michael Wittman Ozanam Center

Holy Rosary is one of fifteen local parishes supporting the Ozanam Center located on the campus of Saint Philomena Church on Euclid Avenue in East Cleveland. The center provides food and clothing to clients living in seven nearby zip codes including our own parish's zip code of 44106. Each Saturday, volunteers help pack and distribute groceries, sort and distribute clothing, and provide hospitality assistance.

Clothing Donations: Seasonally appropriate clothing donations are welcome. Please drop off clothing donations in the Holy Rosary Church hall on Sunday mornings between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. DONATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED THROUGH JULY 27. (NOTE: We do not have extra space for donations until after the Feast in August. Donations will again be accepted beginning on September 1).

Food/Supply Donations: The following items ONLY are accepted by the center: cans of soup, peanut butter, canned fruit, canned chicken, canned tuna, meal-in-a-can (i.e., chili etc.). Toilet paper, paper towels. Items may be dropped off in the Church hall on Sunday mornings between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. or at the Parish Office during business hours.
