My Dear Parish Family:

There is a very small village in the province of Campobasso, Italy who give honor to their patron saint twice a year: June 24th and August 29th. Surrounded by traditional Italian hymns, the faithful anxiously await for the lifelike statue to exit the Church; some with tear-filled eyes, and all with great devotion, both residents and visitors follow the procession throughout the village streets. As the people process, hymns are sung, the Rosary is prayed, and there are those who just follow recalling in their minds the story of Saint John the Baptist, his life, his mission, and his purpose.

Who was John the Baptist? Scriptures tell us that the Angel Gabriel appeared to both Elizabeth, a cousin to Mary, the mother of Jesus, and Zachariah, a priest in his own right from the order of Abijah, to tell them that they would have a son named John, in fulfillment of God's will. The Church celebrates his birthdate on June 24th, six months before Christmas. His formative years were spent in the deserts of Judea where he more than likely became familiar with the many monastic communities, among them the Essenes (a strict Jewish sect). He lived a sacrificial life: he ate locusts and wore a camel's hair garment and a leather belt.

John's strength was his obedient and faithful commitment to the call of God. He was clearly aware of his life's mission; he was chosen to be the "forerunner" for the Messiah, and to prepare the people for the coming of the Kingdom. John was to preach repentance and baptize those who sought forgiveness with water. He *knew* that he was the one to fulfill the prophecy of Isaiah: "*The voice of one crying in the wilderness; prepare the way of the Lord – make His path straight. (Mt 3:3 quoting Isaiah 40:3)*"

John preached and drew great crowds. He spoke the truth to all people, including the religious leaders who came to see. Even in the landscape of his own demise, John was willing to die a martyr for his stand against sin. John was not purposefully trying to stand out as being different. Contrary, when Christ came to him and asked to be baptized, John knew that He *was* the Messiah; God had spoken this. John also knew that it was his time to step back – to decrease and for Jesus to increase.

The devotees of Saint John the Baptist who will be walking in a procession in the Italian village of San Giovanni en Galdo this weekend, and we, who will soon experience another procession in Cleveland's Little Italy on August 15th, must never forget why we honor the Blessed Mother and the saints in such a manner. They are often the vessels that bring us closer to Jesus. How we live and what we do in complete dedication and commitment to HIM will, with the insight of God's Spirit, allow us to understand why you and I must decrease and HE must always increase. The Blessed Mother and the saints are our example.

Just as God had a plan for Saint John the Baptist, He has one for you and me. We may not know the plan and it probably will come in the many stages of our lives, but if we respond to God's call, repent and in all humility obey HIM, then we, too, may be among the saints one day.

Herod, who ordered John's beheading, may have physically killed him, but the Baptist continues to live on in God's kingdom. His light will continue to shine toward Jesus for all to know *Christ as the true Savior, the Lamb of God, and the Son of God.*

**Holy Rosary Tuition Assistance
2018-2019 School Year**

The Diocese of Cleveland encourages parishes who do not operate a Catholic School to provide assistance for children whose families are registered at that parish to attend a Catholic elementary school. This program subsidizes an amount sufficient to cover the difference between parishioner and non-parishioner tuition rates at area Catholic grade schools and allows families to remain active parishioners of their home parish. Father Michael Wittman Ozanam Center

Each Saturday, volunteers help pack and distribute groceries, sort and distribute clothing, and provide hospitality assistance.

Items may be dropped off in the Church hall on Sunday mornings between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. or at the Parish Office during business hours.
