Pope Francis has said, “The Holy Spirit also enriches the entire evangelizing Church with different charisms. These gifts are meant to renew and build up the Church. They are not an inheritance, safely secured and entrusted to a small group for safekeeping; rather they are gifts of the Spirit integrated into the body of the Church, drawn to the center which is Christ and then channeled into an evangelizing impulse.” (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 130)

Introduction: Imagine a parish community where all of the laity have discovered and are using their spiritual gifts and direct them authentically to the heart of the Gospel. We might find that we will have parish communities guided by the Holy Spirit, living in communion, to be mysteriously fruitful. (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 130)

Based on the vision of *Decree on the Lay Apostolate*, a Vatican II document, the Joyfully Gifted Process has been created to form and assist the laity in discovering their charisms or spiritual gifts and to learn how to discern the practical ways they can witness in “deeds”; and to live the vision of the Year of Faith, “Living your faith in Jesus Christ.”
